English Language Fellow Program (ELF)



To date, in Nicaragua, EL Fellows have conducted projects in public and private universities.


Examples of past EL Fellow projects include:

In order to have an English Language Fellow, the interested institution must submit a request describing the project for the ELF commit to cover lodging, food, and local transportation for the ELF during the ten-month of the project.
